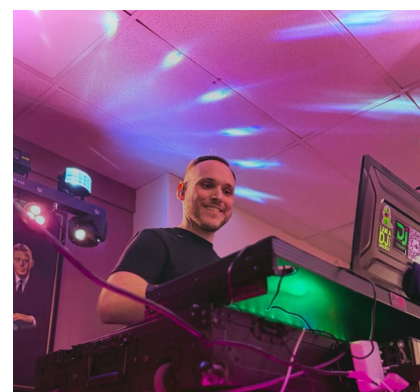

Theresa began drinking in her teenage years to cope with abuse at home and sexuality challenges. At sixteen, she left home and found a sense of belonging in the only gay club in Calgary, Alberta—an environment that also allowed her drinking to spiral further as she spent the next decade drinking to oblivion. In November 1987, her workplace mandated that she attend AA meetings. She connected with the stories she heard there but felt she needed a bit more “research.” While she eventually made the decision to stop drinking and attend AA meetings daily, she never moved beyond Step Five; and chose not to find a sponsor. For more than thirty-two years, she believed “putting the plug in the jug” was enough. She remained “sober” but did not practice AA Principles. Her move to Ottawa, Ontario, in 2020, during the height of the COVID-19 pandemic brought her to an emotional rock bottom. This turning point prompted her to finally embrace the spiritual tools of AA and begin a path of genuine recovery. “Sometimes quickly, sometimes slowly...” all The Promises have since come true for her. Today, her life feels whole — built on sponsorship, the Twelve Steps, service, connection, and community.



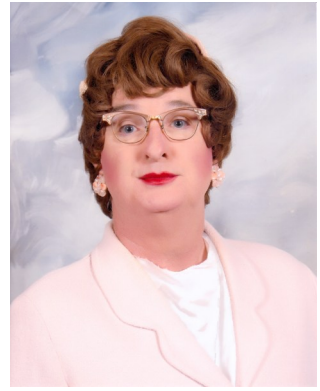
